There is **whistling** at the end of 'When It's A Sunny Day' from Out of the Ark Music @home. They set a challenge to **see if you can whistle.**

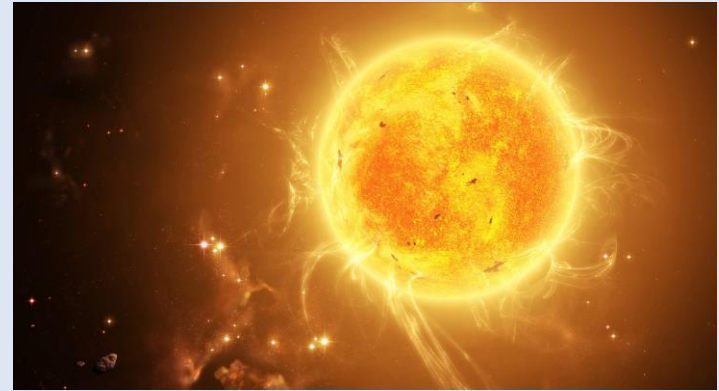
It is not very easy and it will take time and practice just like a musical instrument. If you struggle there is some advice when you follow this link:
