Dear Parents / Carers,

I hope this newsletter finds you well.

Our Year 6 children return today from their 5-day residential at Brathay. I will upload the photographs over the weekend. Enjoy listening to your children's stories and expect some tired children tonight. I have not yet booked the residential for next year as I have not had an opportunity to catch up with staff this week. Also, the KS2 2024 SATs take place week commencing Monday 13th May and the following week is the last week before the half term holidays. All schools are advised not to book residentials for the week after SATs as children who are genuinely off school sick have a 5-day window to complete missed tests.

Well done to our Year 2 children who have completed their Key Stage 1 SATs these past 2 weeks.

At our last data drop, school's attendance was 94.6% (in line with the national average) with 16.8 % of pupils falling into the persistently absent group (PA). If your child is within this category, you will have recently received a letter from the Local Authority Attendance Team. There is a key focus on attendance now from the DfE. Local Authorities and schools are being challenged where Penalty Notices are not being issued for those children who are classed as being Persistently Absent. On a positive note, we have 13 children with 100% attendance and 21 children whose attendance is 99% or higher – well done!
