I hope this newsletter finds you well.

We have finally had confirmation that works on the new windows and remaining external doors will commence in the first week of the summer holidays. The project is scheduled to take 5 weeks to complete, so all should be completed before we return in September. The works are projected to cost more than £80k. This is being funded through the Archdiocese Levy Fund. If you haven't yet sent in your £10 for this year's levy contribution, then it isn't too late to do so.

As we begin to move towards the end of this academic year, it is imperative that ParentPay accounts are up to date. Presently, we have a number of accounts owing large amounts. If you are experiencing any difficulties, please contact the school office.

One of the main education foci at the moment is school attendance. Schools are encouraged to share their data with parents. We've had a large number of holiday request forms in the past 2 weeks and this will significantly affect our data moving forward. As of the 8<sup>th</sup> June, our attendance is as follows: PA = persistently absent (<90% attendance).
