


## **Chaplaincy News**

## Interview with Deacon Paul



We have welcomed our new chaplain, Deacon Paul, to our school since term began and he has been busy getting to know our pupils and staff and seeing what a great place St. Mary's is! A school chaplain is a really interesting role because there are lots of different elements to it, including helping us with the prayer life of the school, developing how we live out our Catholic faith in our school community and beyond and working pastorally with pupils and staff.

Some of our pupils interviewed Deacon Paul, to help us all get to know him a bit better.

#### What's a deacon?

In the Catholic Church, there are three types of ordained men and one of those is a deacon. I'm a permanent deacon. The word deacon comes from a Greek word meaning *service*. You have to study to be a deacon, part time for around four years.

#### Why did you become a deacon?

I felt God was calling me.

### What's your favourite piece of scripture.

It's the bit from St James, which is *faith without works is dead* because it sums up being a deacon pretty well

#### What's your favourite book of the Bible?

Luke's Gospel because I like the style of storytelling.

The number of students who have achieved 100% for attendance during the month of September has been impressive. You will be able to access on Edulink your child's attendance and punctuality to lessons. It is of the utmost importance to us that your child receives the very best education so please reinforce the school's message at home 'Right Place, Right Time'.
