### Safeguarding:

When someone makes a referral, Social Care contact school to ask are we are aware of the incident and if we have any further concerns.

#### Concerns regarding your child:

Any concerns need to be communicated to the class teacher. The most effective way of doing this is via the school office.

#### School Communication Plan:

Accompanying this email is the school's communication plan. This outlines who you should contact, how and the timeframes for a response.

#### **Uniform and equipment:**

Water Bottles: Please label these and ensure it is just unflavoured still water (tap water) in here. Flavoured water and juice is not permitted.

Long hair (everyone): Please ensure long hair is tied with a bobble.

Earrings: These are not a part of school uniform and should not be worn in school. Any newly pierced ears will require a plaster to be worn over the earring. Once healed, plastic hiders may be worn.

#### **Birthdays:**

Your child may come to school in their own clothes. Usually, the child whose birthday it is donates a £1 to CAFOD via the front office. This is a long-held tradition of the school.

After reviewing our practise and after speaking with parents, we will allow children to bring into school, a packet of sweets or cakes for their class friends. Nothing too onerous or expensive. Please ensure noone is left out and before sending in, please contact the office for any allergies or religious requirements. All items sent into school must be nut-free.
