

## **Chaplaincy News**

Last term ended with Mass celebrated in the school hall to mark the end of term and to say farewell to three members of staff who were leaving, and in particular to Brother John after his amazing 34 years of service to the school. It was our first chance to use the new altar in the school chapel at the front of the hall. Mass was concelebrated by six priests, including the archbishop's representative, local clergy and members of Brother John's order, with the school choir rising as ever to the occasion. It was a wonderful and very fitting event.

In the first week of term assemblies focussed on Epiphany – the arrival of the wise men in Bethlehem. They represent the world hearing the news of the Messiah's birth, and all of us on our journey towards Christ. The Bible doesn't give us much detail about them, or even tell us how many there were, but they are such an important part of the story that many traditions have grown up around them. One tradition, which has spread from south Germany and Austria, is to chalk an Epiphany blessing above the door or houses, with the year and the initials of Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar. We've adopted that at school this year, with a blessings appearing above the door to reception and many classrooms and offices.

This week the CAFOD Young Leaders have been running a CAFOD awareness week to make us aware of its work and encourage us to make New Year's resolutions that include some of the Catholic aid charity's aims and campaigns for the year, including the World Day of Peace, help to farmers in developing countries and the Big Lent Walk. ## Catholic Life & Mission at St Mary's

While our pupils returned to school on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> January, school staff returned a day earlier to take part in an INSET which focused on the Catholic Life and Mission of St. Mary's. Our day was led by Dr. Ann Marie Mealey who is Director of Catholic Mission at Leeds Trinity University. Dr. Mealey reminded us that education should empower young people to contribute to building a just world, which is a powerful message for us to relay to our pupils. Education is important and they can use their gifts and talents to make a positive difference in the world. (We tell them that all the time...but it's always good to be reminded!) We learned more about Catholic Social Teaching, which are teachings from the Church that help to build up society and encourage us to stand together with the vulnerable, to work together in communities, to support the poor and to care for the environment.

Dr. Mealey shared the message from Pope Francis, which he addressed to young people. You could copy it and put in on your fridge, as it's a beautiful thing for our families to read.

We have also been impressed with how students adapted readily to changes in arrangements to ensure continued uninterrupted learning despite the adverse weather conditions.

With regards to attendance, it is vital your child is present in school. Having weeks off or broken attendance hinders potential as there is a significant correlation between absence and examination results. Please contact our Attendance Officer Mrs Hampson should you need any further support. Please note that if your child's attendance is 90% this is a concern. This means on average they are missing a day every fortnight across the school year. They will struggle to understand the work they do the following week because lessons are taught in a sequences which rely on prior knowledge. Please could you also be aware that this applies to internal absence from lessons in school such as poor punctuality and visits to the toilet. We reinforce that lessons are for learning time and toilets should be used at break, lunch, before and after school.

It is vital that your child is fully aware of these arrangements. If school has to remain closed, students can access work via their Show My Homework account.
