Comprehension, Word Reading and Writing

Physical Development

Fine Motor Skills and Gross Motor Skills

Indoor PE lessons will take place on a Monday and will be delivered by Mrs Miliken. Every Monday your child/ children must come to school dressed in their PE kit.

This half term Mrs Miliken's lessons will focus upon Dance.

Every Monday the children will take part in a handwriting session (fine motor skills). If handwriting is set as home learning, please ensure that your child is forming each letter correctly - as is shown on the video.

On a Monday Mrs Miliken will deliver a 'dough disco' session. This session will help strengthen the hand and finger muscles. These muscles are very important for writing.

Whilst in our indoor and outdoor classroom the children will have continuous access to resources which will develop both their fine and gross motor skills.

> Without adequate gross motor strength, coordination, and control, it becomes very difficult to master fine motor skills, such as buttoning a shirt, cutting with scissors, and taking off shoes.
