





READING

- In Year 2, the children will be using the sounds and words that they have learned in Reception and Year 1 to read longer and unfamiliar words.
- The children will be expected to read more **fluently** and rely less on sounding out words.
- Children will also be beginning to read with expression.



READING IN CLASS

- Children will be expected to develop their **inference skills** which means being able to <u>'read between the lines'</u> / find clues in the text.
- Children will have a lot of comprehension practise to help them to develop comprehension skills.
- As the year progresses, children will be expected to become more independent with their reading and start to choose their own books, some of which will be longer.
- Some of the children may move onto our Accelerated Reader Scheme where they will choose their own books and then sit a short comprehension quiz online at the end of the book.



READING COMPREHENSION - QUESTIONS TO ASK AT HOME


How do you know someone is talking in a story?

How does punctuation (e.g. full stop) help us to read for sense? Who is the main character in the story? How do you know this?

What would you like the story/text to be about? Which character from the story interests you? Based on the cover, what do you think the story will be about?

Can you find any amazing adjectives? Can you think of another way to begin this story? What was the most exciting part of the story? What made it successful?

Where and when do you think the story is set? What sort of book is it? How can you tell?

COMMUNICATION PLAN

Key points:
